**Another exciting season for chess in Victoria coming up!** Victoria Junior Chess will hold three Island Junior Open tournaments, the Victoria City Junior Chess Championships as well as the Victoria Chess Challenge (by grade) and the Victoria Youth Chess Championship (by age). The Victoria Chess Challenge is a qualifier for the BC Chess Challenge which will be held April 6<sup>th</sup> 2012 in Victoria at Hotel Grand Pacific.

**Registration** Register on site at least 15 minutes prior to the start of an event.

**Entry Fee** \$10 per tournament for IJO 1,2 &3, Victoria City Junior Chess Championship and \$15 for both regional qualifiers. Please pay cash on site. Exact change appreciated. Victoria Junior Chess members may pre pay for the six regular tournaments (IJO 1,2 &3, Victoria City Junior Chess Championship, and both regional qualifiers). Fee for all six is \$50 and this includes an annual membership (see below)

**Membership** Membership in the Victoria Junior Chess Society is optional. An annual membership is \$10 per person. Membership is required to be a voting member of the society. Anyone any age may join the society. Victoria Junior Chess Membership is considered equivalent to BC Junior Chess Membership for Vancouver tournaments. The 2012 AGM is scheduled to be held in October 2012 and will be announced on the Victoria Junior Chess website.

**Lunches** There is usually a break of 45 minutes for lunch. Pizza will be available for pre purchase at UVIC events. Players may want to bring their own lunches and/or drinks. There is usually not enough time to eat offsite.

**Volunteers** Victoria Junior Chess is entirely volunteer dependent. Volunteers are always needed for a variety of tasks. Please let us know what you will be able to help out with.
